Message from the President

January 1, 2021, will be the 25th anniversary of our name change to United Bank of Iowa. the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP). United Bank of Iowa staff put in long hours to assist 1,291 business customers with over \$43 million in PPP loans. This program allowed business customers to continue to pay their employees during the COVID-19 economic shutdown. For some businesses, it simply meant they could keep their doors open.

A final comment or two about the COVID-19 pandemic. We all have fatigue from dealing with COVID-19. The winter of 2020-2021 will no doubt continue to test our will and our emotions as it continues to impact our daily lives. I'm both encouraged and confident that we will see continued strides in both treatment and prevention of the virus in the first nine months of 2021. \$2,196 to West Central Community Action in Harlan designated for the food pantry for residents of Harrison, Monona, and Shelby counties.


\$2,267 to Lotus Community Project in Fort Dodge supporting their efforts to provide facilities and counseling for women and children and to get women back in the work force.
